Defending the autonomy of the region, a senior TRS leader on Friday said that Telangana was under the same threat as Jammu and Kashmir. It was the Centre that insisted on the bifurcation of the state, he said. "Telangana is a disputed territory. After the bifurcation of the state, the Centre will have to start answering questions," the TRS MLA, Tummalam Ramulu, said. "In Kashmir, the Centre is ruling over the state but it is not in power in Jammu and Kashmir. They do not take responsibility. If they do not take responsibility in Telangana, they will have to answer questions," he said. Union Home Minister Amit Shah earlier this month expressed the government's intention to carve out Telangana from Andhra Pradesh. "We are committed to the idea of the bifurcation of Andhra Pradesh," he said. "We are going to make sure that the people of Telangana get justice and live in peace. We will also ensure that the demand for Telangana is respected." Though Ramulu said he was "disappointed" with the Centre's decision, he admitted that "they can't change it now". He said the TRS would join the government in Delhi, but in a private capacity. "Whatever the TRS stands for is not one that can be accomplished with a team in Delhi. The Centre can bring a group of ministers, but it will not be a team. Andhra Pradesh can be run with six ministers and with five ministers. We can't run the state with just four ministers," he said. "If you add two more, that makes it eight." Ramulu said the TRS was in favour of development and not ideology. "I do not say that we are for a new state. If you add two states, the centre has only ensured that the backward region will not have power and water," he said. "We do not have water. We have to drink out of the polluted river Godavari. We do not have water to drink," he added.
